ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

THE ENCLAVE AT VAL VISTA LAKES HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION

AT COMMISSION FOR THE CHARLES

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KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, have this day associated ourselves for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Arizona, and for that purpose do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

- 1. Name. The name of this corporation (hereinafter the "Association") is THE ENCLAVE AT VAL VISTA LAKES HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION.
- 2. <u>Duration</u>. The period of duration of the Association shall be perpetual.
- 3. Principal Place of Business. The principal office for the transaction of business of the Association is located in Maricopa County, Arizona.
- 4. Statutory Agent. The name and address of the initial Statutory Agent for the Association are: David W. Kreutzberg, Storey & Ross, Court One Fourth Floor, 4742 North 24th Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85016.
- 5. Nonprofit Corporation. This Association is organized as a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of Arizona.
- 6. Purpose and Powers. This Association does not contemplate the distribution of gains, profits or dividends to its Members and the specific primary purposes for which it is formed are to provide for the acquisition, construction, management, operation, administration, maintenance, repair, improvement, preservation and architectural control of property owned by the Association for the benefit of its Members and any other areas of Association responsibility within that certain tract of Property situated in Maricopa County, Arizona, which is more particularly described on a plat/map which was filed for record in the office of the Maricopa County Recorder on the 13th day of August, 1987, in Book 314 of Maps, Page 10 and in that certain Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (the "Declaration") which was recorded on the 1st day of December, 1987, as Document No. 87 716780 of the Official Records of the Maricopa County Recorder, and to promote the health, safety and welfare of all of the residents within the above-described Property and any additions thereto as may hereafter be brought

within the jurisdiction of this Association for this purpose, all according to the Declaration.

In furtherance of said purposes, this Association shall have the powers to:

- a. Perform all of the duties and obligations of the Association as set forth in the Declaration;
- b. Fix, levy, collect and enforce Assessments and fines as set forth in the Declaration;
- c. Pay all expenses and obligations incurred by the Association in the conduct of its business, including without limitation all licenses, taxes or governmental charges levied or imposed against the Common Area;
- d. Acquire (by gift, purchase or otherwise), own, hold, improve, build upon, operate, maintain, convey, sell, lease, transfer, dedicate for public use or otherwise dispose of real or personal property in connection with the affairs of the Association;
- e. Borrow money and, only with the assent (by vote or written consent) of two-thirds (2/3) of each class of "Members" (as defined in the Declaration), mortgage, pledge, deed in trust or hypothecate any or all of its real or personal property as security for money borrowed or debts incurred;
- f. Dedicate, sell or transfer all or any part of the Common Area to any public agency, authority or utility company for such purposes and subject to such conditions as may be agreed to by the Members, with no such dedication, sale or transfer being effective unless approval is received from the Val Vista Lakes Community Association, an Arizona nonprofit corporation (the "Master Association" as defined in the Declaration) and an instrument has been signed by two-thirds (2/3) of each class of Members agreeing to such dedication, sale or transfer;
- g. Participate in mergers and consolidations with other nonprofit corporations organized for the same purposes provided that any merger or consolidation shall have the assent by vote or written consent of two-thirds (2/3) of each class of Members; and
- h. Have and exercise any and all powers, rights and privileges which a corporation organized under the Arizona Nonprofit Corporation Act by law may now or hereafter have or exercise.
- 7. Membership Voting Rights. The number and qualifications of Members of the Association, the different classes of membership, if any, the property, voting and other rights and privileges of Members, their liability for "Assessments" (as

defined in the Declaration) and the method of collection thereof shall be as set forth in the Declaration and Bylaws.

tion shall be managed by a Board of not less than three (3) nor more than five (5) Directors (the exact number of which shall be fixed by the Bylaws, or amendments thereof, duly adopted by the Members or the Board of Directors). - g. <u>Dissolution</u>. In the event of the dissolution, liquidation or winding up of the Association, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the Association, the Directors or Persons in charge of the liquidation shall divide the remaining assets equally among the Members in accordance with their respective rights therein except where the Association holds its assets in trust, in which case the assets shall be disposed of according to the applicable provisions of Arizona corporate laws for nonprofit corporations.
- vote or written assent of Members representing seventy-five percent (75%) of the total voting power of the Association, provided however, that the percentage of the voting power necessary to amend a specific clause or provision shall not be less than the prescribed percentage of affirmative votes required for action to be taken under that clause or provision. These Articles are further subject and subordinate to the "Master Declaration" (as defined in the Declaration) and the governing documents of the Master Association and no amendments may be made to these Articles which would render them inconsistent or in conflict therewith. Notwithstanding the foregoing, these Articles may be more restrictive or impose additional requirements on the Members than the foregoing documents.
- Membership, the following actions will require the prior approval of the Federal Housing Administration if either of those agencies has approved the proposed development plan of the Project: Annexation of additional properties, mergers and consolidations, mortgage of Common Area, dedication of Common Area, and dissolution and amendment of these Articles or the Bylaws.
