

Landscape Maintenance, Property Changes, and Architectural Control – Page 3

B. SHRUBS: There are numerous varieties of shrubbery and ornamental flowering plants that may be chosen to fill planting areas along sidewalks and in front of patios. When making a selection, unit owners should take into consideration water requirements and root structures of each plant. **(For example, the oleander plant is not recommended because its very invasive root structure tends to break irrigation pipes.)** One should also consider the fact that the amount of water from the Townhome bubblers is dictated by the landscaping company. If a plant has high water needs, individual unit's water will be required. And as stated in Paragraph 2.B, owners should consider whether they will prune shrubs themselves or have the landscape contractor do it. Following is a list of recommended plants.

Autumn Sage Sierra Linda: Moderate growth, mounding shrub, 1-3', dark green leaf, red/pink flowers attract hummingbirds. Low to medium watering.

Blue Ranger: Moderate growth, 1-3' round shrub, grey/silver leaf, blue/lavender showy flowers, Very low/low watering.

Bush Morning Glory: Ground cover, 1-3' mounding, grey green/silver leaf, white flowers in spring. Very low water.

Cape Honeysuckle: Fast growing shrub, 6-5', dark evergreen leaf, vivid orange/red year round blooms attract hummingbirds. Moderate water.

Chihuahuan Sage: Moderate growth shrub, 3-6', evergreen, lavender flowers attract butterflies. Very low water.

Heavenly Bamboo Dwarf: Moderate growth shrub, 1-3', light green to bronze/red leaf, pink/white flower in spring/summer. Very low water.

Lantana: Ground cover, fastgrowing, 1-3', a multitude of flower colors blooming all year attract butterflies. Medium water.

Mexican Ruellia: Perennial, fast growth, upright 1-3', purple flowers spring through fall attract hummingbirds. Medium water.

Pink Muhly: Mounding grass, 3-6', green leaf, pink flower plumes in fall, Low water.
