Prohibited Plant List

- Any species of trees or shrubs who mature height may reasonably be expected to exceed twenty-five(25) feet, with the exception of those species specifically listed as approved by the Architectural Committee.
- All palms (Palmae) whose mature height may reasonably be expected to exceed six(6) will be prohibited for aesthetic reasons as well as their high maintenance requirements.
- Dwarf varieties of Pines (Pinus), Cypress (Cupressus),
 False Cypress (Chamaecyparis), Juniper or Cedar
 (Juniperus) may be used immediately adjacent to dwellings
 or connecting structures or within the confines of the
 rear yard.
- Olive trees (Olea europaea) except for "Swan Hill" and "Wilsonli" varieties will be prohibited for reasons of profuse production of allergy producing pollen.
- Oleanders (Neriurn oleander) and Thevetia (Thevetia species) will be prohibited for aesthetic reasons, as well as for their profuse production of allergy producing pollen. These poisonous plants will also be prohibited for their high maintenance requirements and excessive height. Dwarf varieties may be permitted within the rear yard.
- All varieties of Citrus will be confined to the rear yard. Because of their production of allergy producing pollen, only one tree of each desired variety should be considered. Dwarf varieties are encouraged.
- Mexican Palo Verde (Parkinson aculeata) will be prohibited as a harborer of pests and its ability to spread throughout the development.
